We have begun the process of direct consultations with our contract partners aimed at building relationships that will strengthen community support for the RCMP, our members, as well as our concerns in future contract negotiations with our employer.



MPPAC President Rae Banwarie and Officer Robert Power met with council members of the City of Red Deer to address policing challenges currently being faced in this central Alberta city. MPPAC represents thousands of RCMP members across the country including RCMP members currently posted in the City of Red Deer. MPPAC is currently in discussion with our contract partners to improve working conditions for RCMP members.

As labour representatives, MPPAC believes that it is critical to bring the RCMP members' experience and knowledge directly to the communities we serve.
