To all RCMP Members, Past and Present,

First and foremost, we would like to congratulate Brenda Lucki on her recent appointment as the new Commissioner of the RCMP. It is our hope, that with her appointment as Commissioner, we will see positive changes for our members and the RCMP.

We are writing to advise all RCMP officers that MPPAC has sought interested party status at the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal involving a case of significant consequence, CHRT T2248/0318, which involves a member of the RCMP being discriminated against based on medical disability. Additional case details can be found below.

MPPAC has appeared before the Senate Standing Committee on National Defense and at the House of Commons Committee on several significant RCMP member issues in the past.

If you are a past member or current serving member whose career has been negatively impacted by decisions made by senior managers in the RCMP; you were forced to leave the RCMP, your career was undermined, or your career is currently under threat via discharge processes due to physical or psychological disability – we want to hear from you.

MPPAC continues to represent members nationally and will be seeking via the Human Rights Tribunal, the ability to allow all members to provide testimony at the Tribunal. During the hearing you will be allowed to state how your career has been negatively affected and impacted as an employee of the RCMP. We know many members have been forced to leave the RCMP as a result of medical or psychological disability. Now you will have the opportunity to have your story heard.

We also extend an invitation to both the AMPMQ and the NPF to stand with us at the Tribunal Hearing when the hearing date is set to seek redress for the members who have been harmed by the unethical and unlawful actions of management within the RCMP.
